They act as mentors, supporting both learning and wellbeing throughout the program. If concerns become more significant, each teacher will collaborate with the Head of Senior School and/or Student Connect staff to provide the best care possible.

Student Connect provides professional wellbeing assistance in collaboration with the teaching team and parents/carers. We find open and regular communication makes a difference to a student's experience while they are at school. We encourage regular contact between SEDA College WA staff, students and parents/guardians; and where appropriate, external support providers. This is critical to ensure each student's individual needs are met.

Our aim is to develop each student's capacity to access support services in their local area that are age appropriate and best placed to assist.

Student Connect also promotes student wellbeing by developing awareness raising activities relevant to the needs of our students.

### MySEDA

MySEDA is the Learning Management System (LMS) that students, parents, teachers and staff use as their central hub for communication, teaching and learning. MySEDA supports parents and guardians to stay connected with real-time access to student assessment, grades, reports, industry experiences and important notifications. 

### MyPlan

MyPlan is a digital portfolio that supports students to track their individual goals, achievements, experiences, and growth during their time at SEDA College WA. Underpinning MyPlans are the Transferable Work Skills and Personal Habits, which have been identified as important attributes, attitudes, and mindsets to develop in order to succeed at SEDA and beyond. Development of the MyPlan portfolio, and the Transferable Work Skills and Personal Habits, is supported with timetabled MyPlan sessions in class and regular MyPlan meetings between teachers, parents/guardians, and students.

# Student Learning

## SPORTS DEVELOPMENT PROGRAM

**ACCREDITED - VET AREAS OF STUDY****The Official**

In this area of study, students explore what it is like to be behind the whistle. Through a celebration of officiating, students develop their knowledge and understanding of officiating at a grassroots level. Interaction and delivery through our sporting partners and state sporting organisations enable our students to obtain a foundation level of officiating in their sport and put the whistle in their hands.

**The Elite Athlete**

In The Elite Athlete, students develop the knowledge and skills required to excel in the fitness and sporting industries. They design and implement a personalised fitness program aimed at achieving peak performance, working alongside a strength and conditioning coach and other professionals. Through applied training and performance monitoring, students prepare for a fitness challenge or sporting competition, gaining real-world experience in elite athletic preparation and performance management.

**NON-ACCREDITED - WACE GENERAL AREAS OF STUDY****Australian Stories**

More than six in ten people living in Australia have had little or no contact with Aboriginal people. This highlights the deep divide between the First Australians and the rest of the nation. The Australian Stories unit explores this through the documentary The Ripple Effect, which shines a light on the connection, culture, and challenges of Aboriginal Australia. Students learn about the beauty, hope, history, and traditions of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples. They also reflect on their own story and create a personal text that shares their experiences and life journey.

**The Power of Sport**

Sport is a universal language. In this English area of study, students explore how sport can influence and shape a community and its culture. Learn and experience how sport can break down barriers and bring people together. Students question and reflect on ideas presented in the

media. Students connect to sporting partners and engage in industry strategies to help build better communities. Fight for your passion and put the Power of Sport at the top of everyone's agenda.

**The Professional**

"The Professional" curriculum encompasses assessments like "Pack Your Bags," simulating interstate work relocations, "Shark Tank," fostering entrepreneurial skills, and "MyBrand Portfolio" development via LinkedIn. Participants navigate challenges of relocation, gain entrepreneurial acumen, and craft compelling digital personas. This experiential learning, students are equipped to thrive in today's competitive landscape, blending practical skills with savvy personal branding strategies, ensuring readiness for professional success.

## CONSTRUCTION AND TRADE PROGRAM

### ACCREDITED - VET AREAS OF STUDY

#### Certificate II in Construction Pathways

Every Monday, students will engage with Skill Hire to undergo theory and practical based VET curriculum as they work to complete their Certificate II in Construction Pathways.

### NON-ACCREDITED - WACE GENERAL AREAS OF STUDY

#### The Builder

In this Materials Design and Technology - Wood Area of Study, students continue to develop skills to plan and construct a range of practical projects including, stud walls, cabinetry, electrical and plumbing fixtures, tiling, concreting, paving and block laying. These skills directly transfer to the projects constructed in the community whilst also providing them with necessary skills to renovate and maintain their own construction projects. This Area of Study culminates in the design and development of a small space mock apartment within the CTP Hazlemere workshops.

#### The Designer

In this Materials Design and Technology - Wood Area of Study students complete a range of design and practical production tasks as they continue to build their skill set. This Area of Study culminates in an ability to engage with a 'client', understanding the needs and opportunities that arise, and successfully navigating the design process to design and develop practical solutions.

#### The Sales Office

The Construction and Trade industries offer a wide range of careers from carpenters and concreters to site managers and sales representatives. In this area of study, students explore how communication and creativity play a role in every part of the industry.

Students learn about the importance of teamwork, safety, and well-being through stories and real-life examples from trade professionals. They use these insights to create their own "SEDA Trade" concept and design a children's picture book that shares a positive message about working safely and supporting

others on the job. This course connects English skills to real-world construction experiences, helping students to develop practical communication, problem-solving, and storytelling abilities that apply on-site and beyond.

#### The Construction Manager

In this Materials Design and Technology - Wood Area of Study, students apply the skills they developed in Year 11 in a more independent setting. They are required to create a client profile, then strategically plan and manage a designed solution in the wood context. It is their responsibility to design the product, develop a production, create efficient materials costing and order sheets and finally manage their time and safe workshop practices to construct their project from start to finish.

# Pathways to Further Education

Students who successfully complete their studies at SEDA College WA have a range of further education pathways available to them.

Throughout their time at SEDA College WA, students are given the opportunity to further explore their career options through the MyFutures Expo, where a variety of tertiary institutes and recruitment specialists present the many opportunities that exist beyond SEDA College WA.

Our partnering universities also provide our students with on-campus visits and experiences in addition to an Information and Application Writing Session to assist students in applying to university. These longstanding partnerships mean that WA universities understand the strengths our SEDA graduates possess, which align with the prerequisites for university entrance, without an Australian Tertiary Admissions Rank (ATAR).

Year 12 students have the option to attend the Notre Dame UniPath program for Metro students, or the Murdoch FlexiTrack program for Bunbury students. Both UniPath and FlexiTrack are designed to help develop the skills needed to succeed at university. The universities work with SEDA College WA to provide a supportive learning experience.

The programs employ both online independent study and dedicated class time. University tutors assess the student learning experience and support teacher facilitators.

SEDA College WA is proud to deliver the WA Aboriginal Education and Leadership Program - our Baldja Mob.

At SEDA College WA, we continuously develop our learning environment to nurture the growth of our Aboriginal students through the Baldja Mob Aboriginal Education and Leadership program. Derived from the Noongar word 'Baldja,' meaning 'firmly united,' our program brings together a vibrant community of Aboriginal students from across Western Australia. Meeting two to three times a term, we promote cultural, educational, and career development through engaging activities.

The Baldja Mob represents a vibrant community of Aboriginal students, whom we are nurturing to become the future leaders of our community. We aim to foster a deep connection with culture, whether it be through the expressive arts of dance, storytelling of our ancestors, or the rich tapestry of Aboriginal culture. Students also have the opportunity to attend a regional camp on Noongar boodjar, and a National Indigenous

camp held in various places across Australia.

We identify tailored pathways for higher education and/or employment, mentoring and supporting our Baldja Mob alumni for sustained success in both wellbeing and career. Collaborating with organisations like MADALAH and the Stephen Michael Foundation enriches our efforts and broadens our students' horizons. MADALAH provides scholarships for our Aboriginal students, believing education is key to generational change.

Our SEDA College WA Aboriginal Engagement team mentors these young leaders academically and culturally, fostering pride in their identity and heritage, empowering them to succeed in the modern world with confidence and resilience.

Together, we shape future leaders while nurturing a legacy of strength, wisdom, and cultural richness for generations to come.


